

As you have noticed I encourage you to seek Jesus, whether you have never met Him or you have known Him for years, you should seek to learn more about Him each day. If you did nothing but study Jesus every moment of your life, you would never learn all there is to know of Him. I also chose to use the symbol of the wise men seeking Jesus for a very important reason; many have read the scripture about the wise men but failed to see all of the significance of God's hand within it.

We see the story of the wise men in Matt 2:1-12; After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him." When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born. "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written: "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel." Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and make a careful search for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him." After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route. So let's examine it a little closer.

First we read that this occurred during the rein of Herod who was not pleased with the possibility that the Messiah's birth, which had been prophesized for hundreds of year, had come true. He would not have wanted this knowledge to become widespread for it would endanger his throne and rule over his people. We can see that his agenda for Jesus was to kill him so that this threat could never become reality, just as he later would put the apostle James the elder to death, and cast Peter into prison. We also see this when he called the Magi secretly to gather information on the birth of Christ. His purpose for sending the Magi to seek out this Messiah was not one of joy but to gather information for the purpose of destroying Christ (If he truly wanted to praise and worship Jesus, he would have sent the priest and teachers and even gone himself). It is also not clear exactly who the Magi were, they were not truly Kings and most likely not wise men. It is possible they were magicians but some feel they could possible have been philosophers or possible men of wealth; but no matter who they were, there agenda was that of evil. Now is when we get to see God's hand again for He comes to these men and changes their hearts, having been warned in a dream (We have seen God's hand in the birth of Jesus and the instrument He used to

guide men to His Son, the star that appear above where Jesus was lying). So this is how they became known as wise, for God touched their hearts and they now desired to find Jesus for the purpose of worshipping Him and presenting Him with offerings.

Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior to whom I seek to learn more about each day. I yearn for His guidance and praise Him for every opportunity to witness in His name. Our chains of bondage, to our sins, have been broken when Jesus died on the cross for us and for all mankind (as long as we repent for those sins). Our eternal life and the chance of spending it with Jesus in heaven is the greatest gift we can receive through His resurrection by the Father and the overwhelming Grace He has for us. I believe in and only teach God's Word, the Bible, His Living Word, and do not recognize the doctrine of any man. Jesus Christ is my Lord and Savior, my Salvation, my reason for each breath I take.


